The central goal of learning a modern language is to learn to communicate in the target language. This includes applying your knowledge of vocabulary, grammar and language structures, as well as using culturally appropriate language.



Interacting

Interacting is done primarily through spoken language.

Exchange information and opinions in a range of familiar contexts, using culturally appropriate language

- socialise with peers
- share information about your own and others' personal worlds
- say how you feel
- explain what you like and dislike, with reasons
- ask questions and describe things you do
- use a range of communication strategies, such as asking for help when you don't understand

Interpret and respond to information, opinions and ideas in spoken, written and multimodal texts

- listen to, read and view information,
 opinions and ideas in texts
- develop and use comprehension strategies
 to show you understand main ideas and
 supporting details in texts
- respond in English or the target language
 to main ideas and details in texts
- demonstrate understanding of the context, purpose and audience of predictable texts
