hen we identify and reinforce positive behaviors, children will do them more. Most often it's the mistakes and misbehaviors that receive much of the attention, but with **Kudos Notes** you can increase feedback and focus the attention on positive performance.

This tested and proven strategy teaches children to receive and give praise. Because Kudos Notes specifically identify a behavior it helps the child repeat that behavior.

Kudos Notes help young people ...

- Identify prosocial behaviors.
- Avoid problematic behaviors and choices.
- Learn to receive positive feedback.
- Give positive feedback to peers and adults.
- Strengthen relationships.

Kudos Notes give attention for the behaviors we want to encourage and increase the **Peace**, **Productivity**, **Health**, **and Happiness** for everyone!

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The Recipe

- Be on the lookout for opportunities to reinforce your child's behavior like getting homework done without being told, completing chores on time, or getting along with siblings.
- When you observe a desired behavior, write a Kudos Note to recognize and reinforce the behavior, including what the young person did and how it made you feel.
- Deliver the Kudos Note or invite the young person to post it where others can see it.
- Help your child create a collection of Kudos Notes to revisit and reflect upon.
