## Play time

**Everyday routines** 

While your child is playing on their own or with siblings, they are learning. Children benefit from long periods of play where they can explore their ideas, problem-solve, use their imagination and practice new skills.

A few ways you can support your child's learning while they are playing include:

- Give your child time to engage in play that they choose. Try to avoid telling them how to play with something or what to play with.
- If your child is engaging in imaginative play, ask them questions about what is happening in the play scenario to extend their thinking.
- Ask what role you can play and support your child's pretend play by getting in character and joining in.
- Role model different ways of doing things or using the materials in the play.
